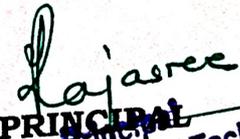

What cancer awareness is about

Prevention: Educating people on how to lower their risk through lifestyle choices like maintaining a healthy weight, being physically active, and avoiding tobacco and excessive alcohol.

Early detection: Helping people recognize the early warning signs and symptoms of cancer, such as unusual bleeding, a sore that doesn't heal, or a change in bowel or bladder habits.

Screening: Encouraging regular screenings and check-ups to detect cancer in its early stages, which often leads to a better prognosis.

Dispelling myths: Addressing and correcting misinformation about cancer and reducing the stigma and fear associated with the disease.

Key risk factors and protective actions

Major risk factor: Tobacco consumption (smoking or chewing) is a significant risk factor for many cancers.

Lifestyle factors: Poor hygiene, unhealthy diet, and lack of physical activity can increase risk.

Protective measures: A plant-forward diet, regular exercise, maintaining a healthy weight, and moderate or no alcohol consumption can help lower risk.

How you can get involved

Support campaigns: Participate in awareness events or donate to organizations that support awareness, education, and research, as highlighted by Indian Cancer Society and World Cancer Day.
